## FELLOWSHIP DESIGNATION POLICY

**POLICY:** According to the By-Laws s.5.06, the Canadian Academy of Engineering (CAE) shall designate the title and initials Fellows may use to identify themselves as belonging to the CAE.

**RATIONALE:** By their election, Fellows of the CAE have been identified by their peers as Canada's most distinguished and experienced engineers. By identifying themselves with the designated initials, this honour is made more evident. It also increases the scope of influence of the CAE.

While Fellow is normally not a word used in the French language, the alternative Membre is not acceptable as only Active Fellows are Members, as defined by the Federal Not-for-profit Corporations Act.

**PROCEDURE:** Active, Emeritus and Honorary Fellows in good standing have the right to use the title and initial designation of Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Engineering (FCAE) in English and Fellow de l'Académie Canadienne du Génie (FACG) in French.

A Fellow who has withdrawn from the corporation will lose the right to use the title and these initial designations.

Fellows are to be encouraged to use the title FCAE or FACG when writing professional items for public dissemination.
